Jordan Cabernet Sauvignon 2004

This renowned Sonoma producer strikes again with a luscious Cab full of dark berry fruits. Not overly tannic but tasty and filling. Noticeably better than the previous vintage, which was not as lively. A good "splurge-worthy" wine. **90**



Forest Glen Magenta Rosé 2007

Strawberry flavors that really pop on your palate. Medium-bodied with solid depth and a lasting finish. An excellent rosé. **89**



Faiveley Bourgogne 2005

Crisp green apple flavors and refreshing overtones. This Burgundian Chard can be enjoyed by itself but is also versatile enough to complement many foods. **88**



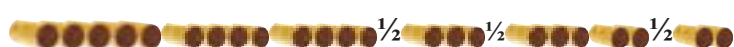
MooBuzz Chardonnay 2006

Let's give this one points for its name as well as its flavors. A sturdy California Chardonnay with hints of butter. Almost lavish in overall taste. Very good. **88**

It's back again with brand new episodes. A fresh new concept bringing together wine and video.



Natura Merlot 2006 - Earthy and smoky, a Chilean offering that is quite different from other Merlot. Really enjoyable, made with organically-grown grapes and pretty intense from first sniff to a delightful finish. **89**

Clos Pegase Mitsuko's Vineyard Pinot Noir 2006 - Always dependably good. Now with a twist-off cap, this Pinot is made of grapes harvested from Carneros. Some time spent in French oak barrels creates a delicate flavor and just a hint of vanilla. **89**

Trivento Golden Reserve Malbec 2005 - From Argentina, this wine displays well-rounded and full-bodied flavors of mint and cherries, among others. Well made with a long, semi-tannic finish. **88**

Ghost Pines Merlot 2005 - Made from a combination of Sonoma and Napa grapes grown on land owned by the famous Martini family, this Merlot feels soft on the

palate. Medium-bodied and a quality finish. A very good Merlot. **87**

Hey Mambo Sultry Red - Described as a bistro style wine, this is a fun blend of no fewer than six different grapes. Full of unique flavors like chocolate and cranberries, this is an easy-drinking wine. Comes with the Zork, a new form of closure. **87**
